A Time of Self Reflection

Please sit as we hold a moment of stillness, followed by confession.

We confess our shortcomings, not for shame nor in guilt, but to wrestle honestly with the impact we have on each other. We share in collective confession to bear witness to the struggles of learning and unlearning under systems of domination and exploitation. In so doing, we remember that grace and accountability are healing friends, not divisive foes. In this spirit, let us join together in confession.

We hold a moment of stillness.

Lord, your arms embrace us with infinite compassion. Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.**

Lord, your heart is open, inviting us to share your life. Christ, have mercy.

Christ, have mercy.

Lord, your Spirit breathes on us with new life. Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.**



From the stillness, hear the words of assurance.

God does not abandon us to the systems that destroy, bind us to our regrets nor forever hold us to what we once believed. God says, come and follow! Know forgiveness and sin no more. Wherever new life is desired, may the peace and forgiveness of Christ be welcomed among us. **Thanks be to God who leads us on paths of resurrection.**

The Collect

A Collect is a prayer that gathers the themes of the service and readings together.

Our God, you are an all embracing, all loving God. We gather to give thanks for all LGBTQIA+ people in our churches and communities. We give thanks for your call on our lives to be bishops, priests, deacons, church wardens, readers and the whole host of roles that support the work of your church. God, we also gather to lament the times that LGBTQIA+ people have not been treated with welcome and ask that you help us to remember that all are welcomed by you regardless of gender identity, race, culture or sexuality. God, in Jesus, you gave us the example of inclusive love and we ask in your name that we might always imitate him and be his hands and feet in the world. Amen.



The Gospel

If it's comfortable for you, you are invited to stand to greet the Gospel. Standing is an ancient symbol in many faith traditions of attentive listening (see Nehemiah 8:5).

Hear the Holy Gospel of Jesus according to St Mathew **Our hearts and minds are open.**

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying: 'Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 'Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. 'Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. 'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. 'Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. 'Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. 'Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 'Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

This is the Gospel of Jesus. **Thanks be to God.**

Our time of prayer will conclude with: Knowing you are hearing us better than we are speaking, we offer these prayers in all the holy names of God. **Amen.**



Sharing the Peace

We share the peace to demonstrate that we are a community that acknowledges its diversity and affirms it and rejoices in it.

Please stand if you are comfortable to do so.

Christ descended to death and hell, passed through doors locked by fear to breathe the Spirit of peace and make us one humanity; nothing can now separate us from the love of God.

Peace be with you and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of that peace.

It is entirely your choice how you share the peace. If you do not wish to shake hands etc. then simply smile and say 'peace be with you'.

But equally, if you do not feel comfortable interacting at all then feel free to sit quietly and simply imagine or pray for love to surround everybody gathered.

The Communion

God is here **God's Spirit is with us.**

In the fullness of time you made us in your image, the crown of all creation. You give us breath and speech, that with angels and archangels and all the powers of heaven we may find a voice to sing your praise:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

How wonderful the work of your hands, O Lord. As a mother tenderly gathers her children, you embraced a people as your own. When they turned away and rebelled, your love remained steadfast. From them you raised up Jesus our Saviour, born of Mary, to be the living bread, in whom all our hungers are satisfied. He offered his life for sinners, and with a love stronger than death he opened wide his arms on the cross.

On the night before he died, he came to supper with his friends and, taking bread, he gave you thanks. He broke it and gave it to them, saying: 'Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.'

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said: 'Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for man for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life Lord Jesus, come in glory.



Father, we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross; we remember his dying and rising in glory, and we rejoice that he intercedes for us at your right hand.

Pour out your Holy Spirit as we bring before you these gifts of your creation; may they be for us the body and blood of your dear Son. As we eat and drink these Holy things in your presence, form us in the likeness of Christ, and build us into a living temple to your glory.

Bring us at the last with Blessed Mary and all the saints to the vision of that eternal splendour for which you have created us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.



Together with all disciples across the world, as our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

Eternal Spirit, Earth-maker, Pain-bearer, Life-giver, Source of all that is and that shall be, Father and Mother of us all, Loving God, in whom is heaven: The hallowing of your name echo through the universe! From the grip of all that is evil, free us. For you reign in the glory of the power that is love, now and for ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

All are welcome to receive communion here. If you would like to receive a blessing instead, please hold this service sheet in your hands. There is no obligation to receive a blessing or the sacrament. If you do not want to receive the sacrament or a blessing please feel free to just sit and listen to the music. Come as you are.


